

Why We Pray the Lord's Prayer

In 2024 it is good for us to begin with prayer.

Jesus shares an example of how we are to pray when he offers what we have come to call the Lord's Prayer in Matthew 6:9-15. The prayer is corporate, not personal: In the prayer we use words like "our" and "us," rather than words like "my" and me."

The prayer begins with our focusing on God and on God's will, not on our immediate perceived needs. The prayer begins with our acknowledging that we may not be seeing the world correctly. The prayer focuses on the past ("forgive us our debts"), the present ("give us this day our daily bread"), and the future ("lead us not into temptation").

The Lord's Prayer, more than anything else, calls us to open ourselves to a dependence on God. Any well-intentioned plan of building a kingdom needs to involve talking with the king. If we run so fast that we don't have time to get on our knees, we lack a relationship.

In my study at home, I have a reminder of why I need to pray. A sign there says "God's voice calms, comforts, convicts, encourages, enlightens, leads, reassures, stills. Satan's voice obsesses, worries, condemns, discourages, confuses, pushes, frightens, rushes."

That is why I pray. Our lives leak all sorts of things. That's fine, since we were built to leak. Hopefully we leak out joy, and love, and clues of the presence of God.

GOD's VOICE SATAN's VOICE CALMS OBSSESSES COMFORTS WORRIES CONDEMNS CONVICTS DISCOURAGES **ENCOURAGES** CONFUSES ENLIGHTENS LEADS **PUSHES** REASSURES FRIGHTENS STILLS RUSHES

But sometimes what leaks out of us is bitterness, condemnation, confusion, and shortness with others. The things of Satan.

Mother Teresa said, "Pray. I must be able to give only Jesus to the world. People are hungry for God. What a terrible meeting it would be with our neighbor if we give them only ourselves."

The sad thing is that we do give out only ourselves unless we fill ourselves up through prayer.

Discipline forms you into a disciple. Prayer—day by day—allows you to become a disciple.

Join us in worship as we start this year with a focus on the Lord's Prayer. Through your prayers, may God fill

you so completely that you find yourself leaking faith, hope, love, kindness, and grace to all whom you meet.




For the Children Kids' Travel Guide to the Lord's Prayer
